


Lake Riley 2024 Herbicide Treatment

RPBCWD received a permit from the Minnesota DNR to control Curly-leaf Pondweed (CLP), an invasive aquatic plant, using an approved aquatic herbicide. See map for treatment area locations. RPBCWD will hire a experienced contractor to apply aquatic herbicide to the lake. The treatment will occur at no cost to residents.



What: Herbicide treatment (Diquat)

Where: Within designated area(s) on lake (see map on front)

Why: To control Curly-leaf Pondweed, an invasive aquatic plant

When: May 1st (subject to change due to weather)

After a Diquat treatment, the DNR recommends <u>not using</u> the water for these activities for these number of days:



Swimming
No restriction



Drinking 3 days



Irrigation 5 days
