EVENTS

Water Resources Summit

Water Resources Manager Josh Maxwell hosted the annual Water Resources Summit for partner organizations on February 27, 2025. The summit provided an opportunity to share monitoring results, planning efforts, and identify potential partnering opportunities.



Lake Association Summit

Fourteen representatives from eight lake/homeowner associations attended the 2025 Lake Association Summit at the RPBCWD office on March 19th. The event provided an opportunity for staff to provide an overview of the District's role in watershed protection, how to achieve a healthy lake, and capital improvement projects. The group participated in a shoreland scoring activity as part of the introduction to the Shoreland Health Evaluation program.

Open House: North Lotus Lake Water Quality Improvement Project

Two open houses were held in 2025 to collect input on preliminary concepts for the North Lotus Lake Water Quality Improvement Project. A mini-open house was held on June 8, 2025 at North Lotus Lake Park as part of RPBCWD's Creek Week activities. The exhibits including an overview of water quality

projects identified in the Lotus Lake watershed, an updated preliminary concept for the North Lotus Lake Park project, and two exhibits to collect input on components including art that could be incorporated into the project. A second open house was held in conjunction with an open house for the City of Chanhassen's Pavement Rehabilitation Project on November 19.

Evening with the Watershed

83 local leaders, community members and partners joined RPBCWD on October 23rd at the historic Goodrich-Ramus Barn near Staring Lake for *An Evening with the Watershed*.



The evening began with a social hour, followed by dinner and a presentation highlighting district projects, programs and highlights of the last 10 years. The evening capped off with an award ceremony recognizing some of RPBCWD's outstanding volunteers and water stewards.

STEM on Tap

RPBCWD partnered with Nine Mile Creek Watershed District and the City of Eden Prairie to offer six STEM on Tap workshops for area K-12 educators. Topics for the year included ornithology, GIS, Winter Tree ID, Art & STEM, Genetic Counseling, and Phenology. Over 100 teachers attended a 2025 workshop.

Creek Week

The District hosted its third annual Creek Week in June 2025. The District hosted its 3rd annual Creek Week in June. The week kicked off with Yoga in the Park and the 10th annual Cycle the Creek bike tour, followed by a park pop-up at North Lotus Lake Park, where visitors to the park could mingle with RPBCWD staff, play games, create artwork, and get an ice cream treat while enjoying a beautiful Sunday afternoon. Next, a Build Your Own Rain Barrel workshop hosted at the RPBCWD office had participants convert retired wine barrels into rain barrels to capture roof runoff. A Paint & Sip with Natural Inks packed the house at the OG Coffee & Wine Bar, while A Learn-to- Canoe Night with the Staring Lake Outdoor Center promised to be a great evening before inclement weather forced a cancellation. The sky cleared up just in time for Friday's Volunteer Wetland Planting at the site of the Pioneer Trail Restoration Project.

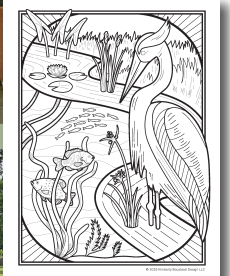
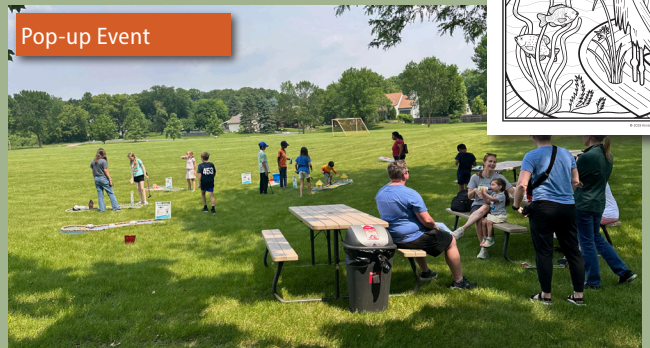

Events from Creek Week 2025



Native Plant Workshops

RPBCWD partnered with Carver County Water Management Organization and Carver Soil & Water Conservation District to offer two Native Plant Workshops in 2025. The first workshop was held on April 10 and was a general introduction to native plantings and their impact on water quality. The second workshop on August 5th was geared towards maintaining existing projects and identifying common threats to native plantings.



Discover Your Watershed Party



On September 24, RPBCWD partnered with Nine Mile Creek Watershed District and the City of Eden Prairie to host a 'Discover Your Watershed' Party at the Preserve Association Barn. Over

50 community members stopped by for barbecue and to learn more about cost share programs and ways to get involved in protecting our water resources.

Christmas Tree Giveaway

On December 13, RPBCWD partnered with The PROP Shop of Eden Prairie, PROP Food Shelf and the EP Schools Family Resources Program to



give away Christmas trees and tree stands to families in need. Mugs of hot cocoa and a blazing fire countered the bitterly cold temperatures as families picked up their trees. The trees came from a former Christmas tree farm owned by the Standal Family in Eden Prairie, the site of the Spring Road Conservation Project. The stands were donated by members of the community.

VOLUNTEERS



Adopt a Dock

Adopt a Dock is a citizen science initiative where lakeshore residents monitor for aquatic invasive species. In 2025, 23 households used passive plate samplers to monitor for zebra mussels on Duck, Lucy, Lotus, Mitchell, Red Rock, Riley, and Silver lakes.



Adopt a Drain

In 2025, 91 participants adopted 147 storm drains within RPBCWD, preventing 1,974 pounds of leaves, sediment, salt and other debris from entering our waterways. Led by Hamline University, Adopt a Drain allows individuals to adopt a storm drain in their neighborhood and pledge to keep it clear of leaves and debris throughout the year while logging their impact in an online portal. Across all of Minnesota, the Adopt a Drain program kept 164,125 pounds of debris out of waterways in 2025.

Minnesota Water Stewards

A partnership with the Freshwater Society, Minnesota Water Stewards trains and supports community leaders to reduce water pollution and educate their community to conserve and protect our waterways. The program was placed on pause in 2025 to allow for a program restructure. 24 past stewards continued their service hours within the District.

Citizen Advisory Committee

Staff Forbes and Staff Mahon serve as liaisons for the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC). In 2024, the CAC had 10 members and held 11 meetings. Seven meetings featured internal (staff) and external guest speakers. One CAC member serves on the Stewardship Grant review committee.

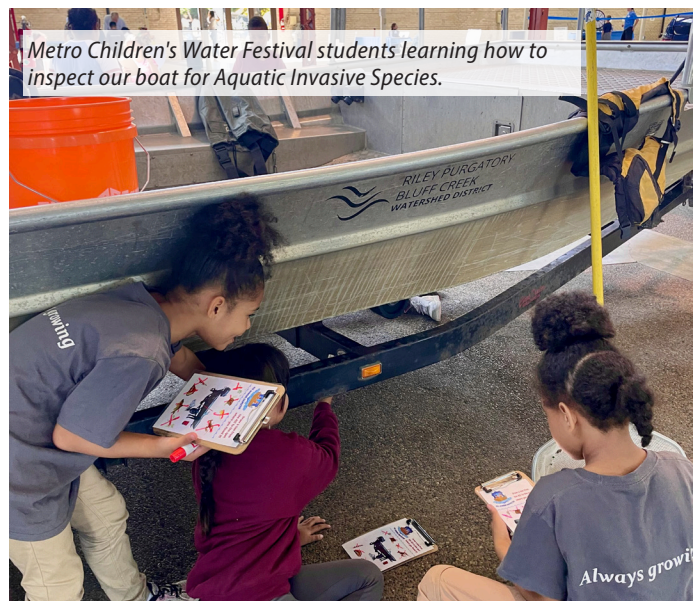

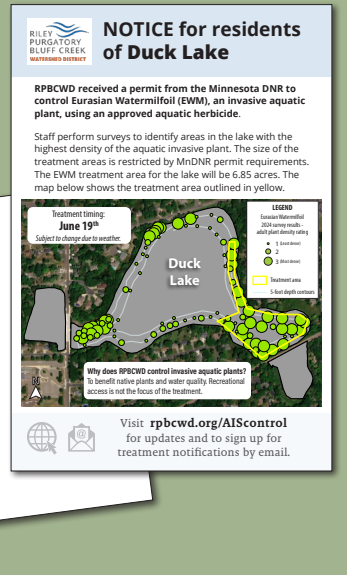

Direct Mail

Herbicide treatments to control aquatic invasive plants were conducted on six lakes in 2024. Before the treatments, property owners adjacent to the treatment sites were notified with a postcard mailing. A website link was provided on the postcard so that residents could find out the latest information about treatment timing. Lake residents were also encouraged to sign up for a the lake email notification service established in 2023. Lake association leadership were also emailed regarding treatment timing so that they could share the information with

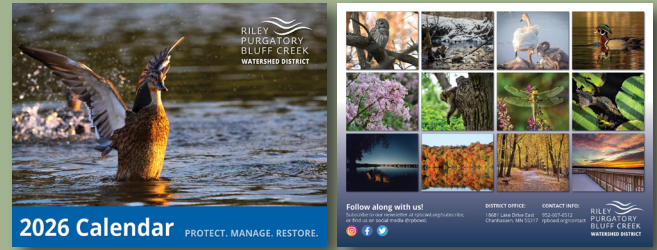

Other Communication Items

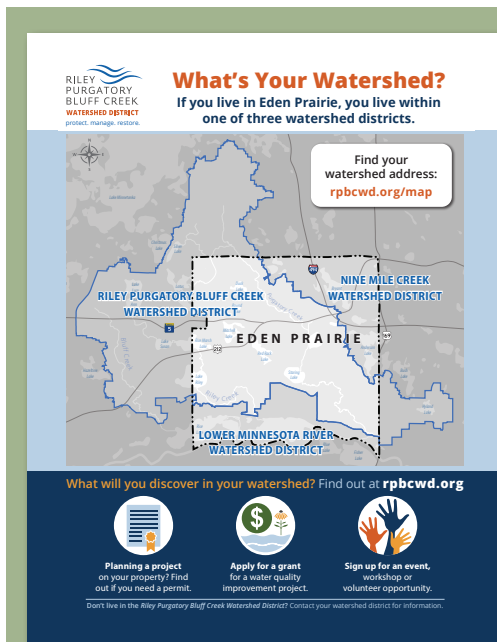
